81001	Sabine Hay Oldfield Lane Warren Carr Derbyshire DE4 2LN	House. Late C18 and mid C19. Coursed squared gritstone with gritstone dressings and quoins. Plain tile roofs with stone gable end and ridge stacks. Stone coped gable with plain kneeler to east gable of western addition. Two storeys, L-plan, three bays by two bays. South elevation has two bay C18 cottage to east with advanced, higher C19 addition to west. C18 cottage has flush quoined doorcase with wooden porch over. To west, 2-light flush mullion window with shutters, to east, C19 plain sash in flush surround. Above, two 2-light flush mullion windows. To west, in C19 addition, plank door under plain lintel with casement window over in flush surround. East elevation - C19 addition has large central two storey canted bay window, with plain sill bands and moulded cornice. Four pane fixed light windows to all sides above and below.	II	14/02/1985
81146	Former Powder House Oldfield Lane Warren Carr Derbyshire	Magazine or dry powder store. Circa 1880. Coursed rubble gritstone with brick; cement-rendered blue brick tunnel vaulted roof. Single chamber with entrance to E. 'Over-constructed' to withstand explosion. Walls with marked batter. Dressed stone eaves band. Internally the roof is reinforced with heavy purlins, rafters, and shuttering and there was originally an internal timber lining. A remarkable survival associated with the now demolished Millclose lead mine.	II	25/02/1991
